# MINUTES OF THE HOWEY-IN-THE-HILLS TOWN COUNCIL MEETING HELD MARCH 9, 2009

Mayor Sears called the Town Council Meeting of March 9, 2009 to order at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Sears led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Councilor Ernest led the Invocation.

Present: Mayor Sears, Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson, Councilor Ernest, Town Attorney Blom-Ramos and Town Clerk Brasher. Also present, Police Chief Robbins and Public Works Director Padgett.

## **CONSENT AGENDA**

Minutes of Regular Town Council Meeting of February 23, 2009 and Special Master Work Session of February 23, 2009

Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson, seconded by Councilor Ernest, moved to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Motion carried 3-0 with a roll call vote.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

Councilor Ernest, seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson, moved to move agenda item no. 9 to item no. 2 on the agenda. Motion carried 3-0 with a roll call vote.

## Discussion: Adoption of Watering Restrictions Implemented by SJRWMD Effective March 8, 2009

**Nancy Christman,** representative from SJRWMD presented water conservation flyers and said the water restrictions have been modified effective March 8, 2009. **Ms. Christman** said the following watering restrictions are effective March 8, 2009:

- Daylight saving time, 2-day a week odd and even addresses for irrigation.
- 2. Eastern standard time, 1-day a week, on even and odd addresses for irrigation.
- 3. Nonresidential irrigation is permitted on Tuesday and Friday during daylight saving time and Tuesday on Eastern standard time.
- 4. No more than 1 hour, per zone, per day for irrigation
- 5. If reclaimed water is available, private wells are prohibited.

Discussion ensued

### Boat Docks: Proposal for Repair/Replace of Two Closed Docks

**Park & Recreation Chairman Ormsbee** discussed dock replacement along Lakeshore Blvd. while the Town has the permit for replacement. Discussion ensued. **Mayor Sears** said time is of the essence since the Town has the permit in place.

It was the consensus of the Town Council to discuss this item at the March 23, 2009 Town Session.

Discussion: Intent of Proposed Use of Leased Portion of Property Adjacent to Whispering Hills

Lee Chotas, representative for Bredco Development Trust. He further stated he was surprised

that an adjacent land owner to this project had been asked to attend the Town Council Meeting to answer questions.

## Town Planner stated the following:

- 1. The property in question is in the approved Preliminary Subdivision Plan and the developer had been notified that a marina was unacceptable unless they limit the marina to strictly homeowners.
- 2. She further stated the Developer Agreement says the Lessee should monitor what is happening with the property and she feels this has not occurred.

**Mr. Chotas** said the lease agreement says the lessee shall monitor the property and the developer and owner shall utilize ingress and egress to the property.

Clay Frankel, representative for Whispering Hills said the following:

- 1. The Town squashed the idea of a public marina.
- 2. The area in question has been identified and approved as a park.

**Town Planner Shira** stated for the record that she has been involved in this project for 4 years and she was led to believe that the separation of the property in question was intended for a single family lot, which is dishonest and misleading. Once the lease was reviewed, it was the intention to build a marina. She further stated Mr. Frankel stated on numerous occasions that he had no idea what the land in question would be used for.

**Mr.** Chotas gave information with regards to the owners' knowledge of the project. Clay Frankel said when the Town decided not to allow the marina to go forward, he did not know what the lessee intended to do with the property.

Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson asked Mr. Chotas if his client would furnish a letter of intent. Mr. Chotas said the letter of intent would be provided. Town Attorney Blom-Ramos said she would like to obtain copies of the permits issued. Town Attorney Blom-Ramos said if the Town decides they do not want a marina, that and the park land needs to be addressed. Town Planner Shira said she is still confused and the Town needs a legal description as a Developer Agreement from Red Jacket called for a private yacht club and the permits need to be reviewed.

**Mayor Sears** said this item was listed as a discussion not for a decision to be made this evening. **Councilor Ernest** said the Town needs to see the documentation in able to make a decision.

Ron Jacobs voiced his concerns with the letter from the lessees' attorney.

**Mayor Sears** said this meeting was not intended to make a decision with regards to this project; this meeting was for informational purposes only.

Consideration and Approval of Website Proposal B&H Consultants, Inc. presented a website proposal.

**Mayor Sears** said the update of the website will offer more information to the public. Discussion ensued regarding funding of the website. **Mayor Sears** explained the website fees to the public.

<u>Councilor Ernest</u>, seconded by <u>Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson</u>, moved to approve the website proposal by B&H Consultants, Inc. in the amount of \$4,375 for the value design package.

#### Motion carried 3-0 with a roll call vote.

## Discussion/Action on Five-Year Capital Improvements Program

**Town Planner Shira** stated the Town must have a Five-Year Capital Improvement Plan. She discussed the current plan in place and addressed items in the plan. Revisions to the plan will come back on the April 13, 2009 Town Council agenda.

Consideration and Approval of Proposal for Survey of Water Plant Property

Town Engineer Shira gave detailed background on this item. Mr. Shira gave survey quotes and asked for direction from the Town Council

Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson, seconded by Councilor Ernest, moved to approve the survey of the water plant property in the amount of \$6,440. Motion carried 3-0 with a roll call vote.
