Mayor Sears called the Town Council Meeting of March 23, 2009 to order at 6:00 p.m.

## Interview GrayRobinson for Town Legal Services

**Tom Wilkes** and **Heather Blom-Ramos** were present for the interview. **Tom Wilkes** said they enjoyed working with the Town and feel they have served the Town well during the past three years and would be pleased to continue serving the Town.

Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson asked about the billing process. Mr. Wilkes explained the billing process. Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson asked if the current rates would remain in effect. Mr. Wilkes said there will be a rate increase. Councilor Green said he has been working with GrayRobinson and all calls have always been returned. Councilor Ernest asked how the travel time is billed. Mr. Wilkes said it is 45 minutes each way.

### Interview Richey & Cooney for Town Legal Services

**Gary Cooney** was present to answer questions. **Mr. Cooney** gave the Town Council information on his background. He further stated he is familiar with Town history as he was formally the Town attorney.

Councilor Green asked who would fill in, in his absence. Mr. Cooney said there are attorneys in Lake County who fill in for each other. Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson asked about the billing process. Mr. Cooney said they bill monthly and bills in ¼ hour increments. He further stated he does not charge for phone calls and gave an example, as communication is important. He further stated he starts charging when the meeting starts. Councilor Ernest asked the rate. Mr. Cooney said he submitted \$250 an hour but he works within the budget constraints of the Town unless an unusual situation arises.

**Councilor Green** gave his opinion regarding the legal representation with the C.D.D. **Councilor Ernest** voiced similar concerns. **Councilor Nebel** voiced her concerns with Gary Cooney. **Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson** voiced his concerns with GrayRobinson travel time and billings. Discussion ensued.

**Police Chief Robbins** voiced his concerns with a billing incident with Gray Robinson. He further stated he is a tax payer in the Town and as a Department Director he does not feel he should be billed for something he had to explain to the attorney.

**Mayor Sears** informed the Town Council that the Town is over budget with regards to legal fees.

**Janice McClain** said the Town should negoiate rates and to look towards the smaller firms and hire out for major litigations.

**Bob Olsen** said he was happy with the services Gray Robinson provided.

<u>Councilor Green</u>, seconded by <u>Councilor Nebel</u>, moved to retain Gray Robinson as the Town legal council. Motion passed 4-1 with a roll call vote.

Councilor Nebel left the meeting at 6:55 p.m.

**Minneola Mayor Yeager** spoke with regards to a Para Mutual and asked for the Town's support.

Councilor Ernest, seconded by Mayor Pro-Tem Johnson, moved to adopt Ordinance No. 2009-005. Motion carried 4-0 with a roll call vote.

Second Reading and Adoption of Ordinance No. 2009-006, An Ordinance of the Town Council of the Town of Howey-in-the-Hills, Lake County, Florida Relating to Planned Unit Development District Regulations; Revising Article IV of the Land Development Regulations to Include Requirements Regarding Construction Plan Approval and to Provide A Time Limit to Commence Construction of Required Improvements; Providing for Applicability to Existing Planned Unit Developments; Repealing Conflicting Ordinances; Providing for Updates to the Land Development Regulations and Ratifying Unamended Provisions of the Land Development Regulations; Providing for Severability and Providing for an Effective Date
